Parkview does <u>not</u> have a paid custodian. We are currently paying several people for a few hours of work each week and depending on volunteers for all the cleaning. Please see Patti Rang if you are able to assist. with light cleaning, such as dusting blinds and window sills, washing windows, helping with vacuuming, and cleaning the pew chairs.

Many tasks indoor and out are required to maintain our Church, including resetting the sanctuary after funerals and events. All of these tasks are completed by volunteers. All skill levels and ages can assist.

If you see something in the building or on the church grounds that needs maintenance, there are maintenance work request forms in the lobby. Fill out and drop in the hanging file folder in front of the office door. We have a pile of work order requests that need to be completed currently, and we need volunteers to help with those orders. Please speak with Chris Marcott if you are able to help.

We are always looking for volunteers to mow the grounds. Chris Marcott has a mowing calendar on the main bulletin for sign ups. Please add your name to the calendar and list the section of the yard you are able to mow.

**Items we currently need donated: box cutters, weed trimmers, weed spray. Donations will be labeled as church property and kept in the maintenance room.

News from the Lead Team:

- The Lead Team discussed the current printer contract and made the decision to not renew the printer contract at the end of it's term and to purchase a laser printer for the church next summer when the lease is up. This will save us a substantial amount of money.
- Lead Team voted to hire the new pastor, with a start date of September 1st, 2024.
- Tech team is looking into additional security measures, such as a ring camera at the front door.
- We are providing a list of volunteer opportunities to host groups at the church. Please sign up to help host these groups.
- Tina and Melora are constantly updating the calendar and events on the new website. Check online for scheduled upcoming events.
- Property update: The lease with the city for Sunflower park has been finalized. The city will pay \$20,000 for a year lease that will expire on June 2025. The city will be responsible for the mowing and care of the property they lease and will maintain liability for the property. Lead Team voted to approve the lease agreement. The city plans to purchase the property at the end of the lease agreement.
